Laundry to Landscape Rebate Program

## What is Graywater?

Graywater is lightly used water from your bathroom sinks, showers, tubs and clothes washer. It's a little dirty, but a safe and effective water supply for most landscapes.

## What is Laundry to Landscape?

A graywater laundry to landscape system delivers water from your clothes washer to your landscape without additional pumps, filters, tanks or permits.

## Why Graywater?


- Cost-Effective: Up to \$400 rebate (\$200-\$400, depending upon your city or water retailer) is available when completing the Steps to Participate below.
- Drought-Proof: Even with drought restrictions, you'll be able to water your plants every time you run your laundry.
- Sustainable: Powered by equipment you already own (your clothes washer), graywater is naturally filtered in mulch basins installed adjacent to your trees or shrubs.
- Assistance: Valley Water staff are available to answer questions and provide resources to help plan your project.

## **Steps to Participate**

- Prepare and Plan: Contact Valley Water's Water Conservation Hotline at (408) 630-2554, scan the QR Code (lower left corner on the other side) or visit watersavings.org.
- Apply: Submit your Graywater Laundry to Landscape Rebate Application, along with all requested materials to Valley Water.
  - Notice to Proceed: Complete your project within 90 days of receiving a Notice to Proceed. Do not begin beforehand.
  - Post Inspection: Schedule and pass a post-installation inspection.
    - Other requirements: Rebate caps and additional requirements apply. Participation in this rebate program is subject to funding availability.

#### **Guidelines to Remember:**

Please note that Valley Water adheres to Chapter 15 of the 2016 California Plumbing Code and additional requirements imposed by any local enforcement agency. All rebate participants will also need to follow these guidelines.
